

## Outlines of English Immersion Curriculum

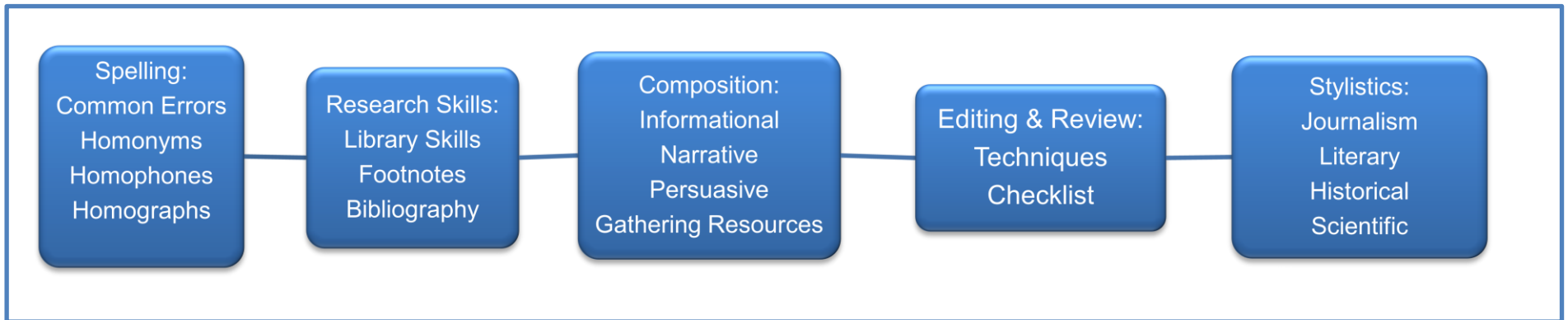
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1. The curriculum includes more than the textbook: application of methodology, testing structure, review activities, language pledge, buddy system, high teacher – student ratio, etc.
2. High performance in an academic setting is the primary goal: Academic Writing, Critical Thinking, Oral Proficiency
3. Tests and activities will reflect the academic requirements of America’s top ranked universities: Harvard, Yale, CMU.
4. The courses will be taught in English and students will be required to carry out all assignments in English
5. The textbook will be based on three parts: Academic Writing, Critical Thinking, Oral Proficiency.
6. Lessons will be task based. Students will be ranked according to how many tasks they complete successfully.
7. Appendices will appear in back for complete reference of vocabulary and grammar
8. Reinforcement activities will be dynamic, entertaining, and highly competitive: game shows, debates, presentations.

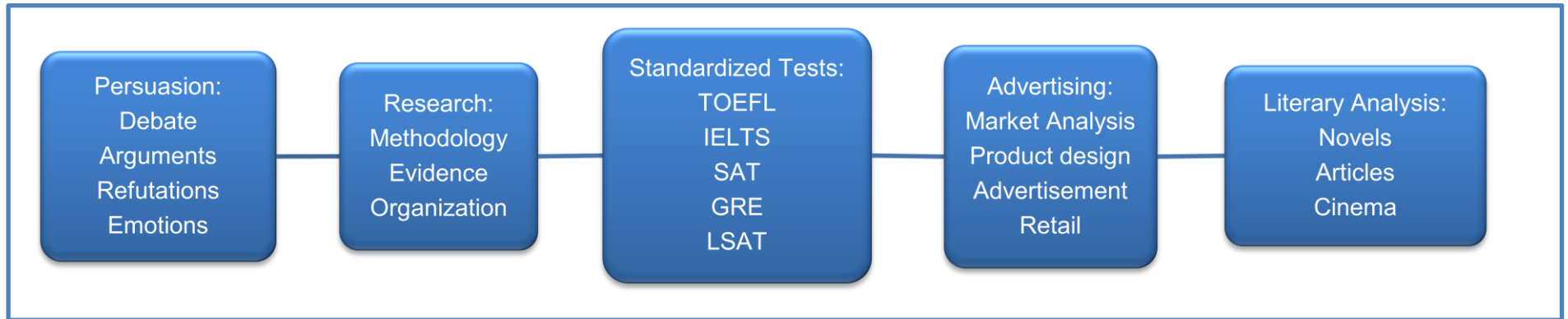

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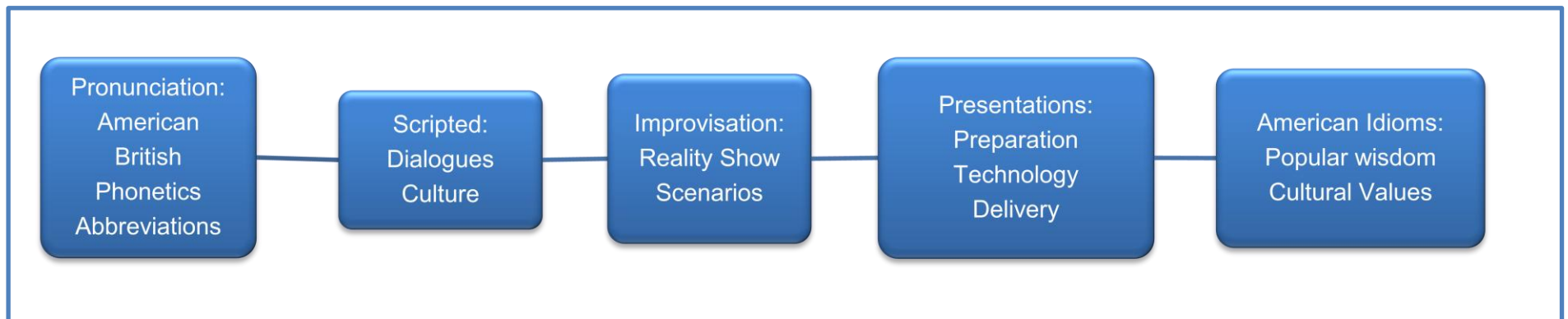
